The Whoop-Whoop sounds seemed to be quite close by this time. It was only then that he realised that the watch had detected what appeared to it to be a Critical Incident requiring immediate assistance. It had thus instigated a text message to Graeme's wife to advise her that Graeme had came to some harm. The sound had been coming from his phone in his Flipbelt worn round his waist all the time and wasn't the rarely seen Lesser Spotted Garmin after all. After a bit of assistance in reading what was on his watch and messages on his phone he was able to advise his wife that all was well and she could therefore stand down the search party. So if you have one of the fancy Garmin watches which offers Incident Detection be aware that they are prone to send out false alerts triggered by as little as a sudden stop when doing even a relatively slow run. Or at least carry reading glasses to respond to the watches alert within the 30sec you get to cancel the alert. (Very small text).

Anyway on to the important stuff. A good turnout on such a poor night with 14 starters. The first 3 finishers on the night were Morag, David and Martin, who all managed to finish under the Handicap time. And well done to Nathan who posted a new Pb for the course.

Best 3 Age graded% were Dru (66.21%), Morag (64.49%) and Martin (62.19%).
