

Nairn 10k - A Fast and Sunny Start to the Year

The Nairn 10k, organised by Nairn Road Runners, welcomed 300 athletes on a sunny but windy afternoon with temperatures around 10 degrees. Runners from the Highlands and beyond, including a contingent from Fraserburgh Running Club, gathered on Nairn High Street for an afternoon race. On a non windy day the 10k route offers a fast, open experience with minimal turns, leaving the town and winding back for a rapid finish under the iconic Town Clock.

The atmosphere was electric as the race kicked off, with the High Street packed with supporters and they were all rewarded by a course record: Sean Chalmers of Aberdeen Athletics broke the record by 30 seconds which has stood since 2012.

The event, first held in 1988, continues to be a firm favourite in the running calendar, and we are all eagerly awaiting the return of the much anticipated Turkey Trot and the Nairn Half Marathon later in the year.

With its friendly atmosphere, efficient organisation, and fast course, the Nairn 10k has once again proven itself as a fantastic early season race.
