Carol still leads the way on 52pts from Jim Bowie on 38pts who both failed to score tonight. Biggest winner on the night however was Morag who has jumped into 3rd spot on 36pts. They have however all scored in 8 or more races So plenty to look forward to in the final two races.

The leading three Age graded% were Robbie Youngson (81.28%), Lisa (77.39%) and Dash (76.57%).

So after 10 races the Age Graded table is still headed by Robbie, Lisa and Carol. with only 0.01 of a point between Lisa and Carol. (241.82 v 241.81). See results sheets for full details of everyone's run)
